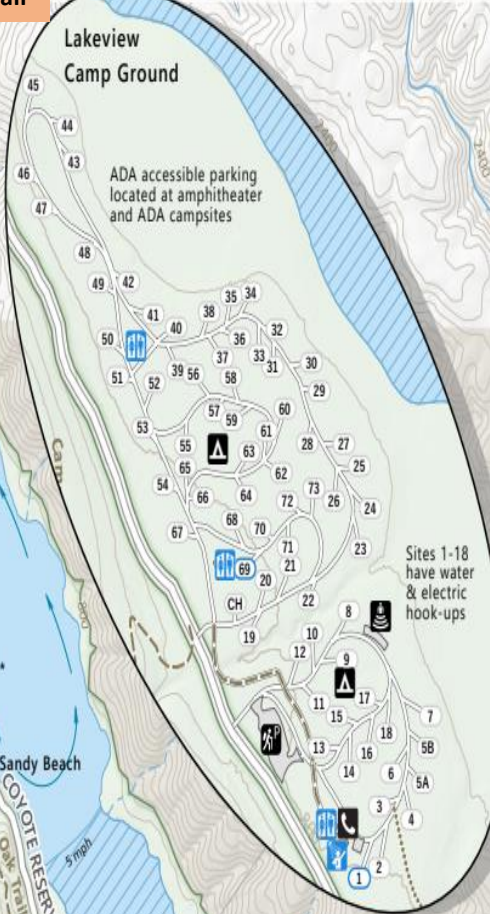


the entrance station. No fee charges at the Mendocino Ranch or Harvey Bear Entrance

- Dogs/Pets:** Allowed in all areas of the park on a 6 foot or less leash.
- Fires:** Permitted in designated barbeque pits only. No fires on open ground or along shoreline. No wood gathering.
- Camping:** Only in designated areas. Maximum stay 14 days/year (with 14 days maximum between Memorial Day and Labor Day).
- Weapons:** Firearms, air guns, archery equipment and paintball guns are prohibited
- Smoking & Alcohol:** Alcohol permitted in picnic and beach areas. All alcohol laws strictly enforced. Smoking is prohibited in County parklands.
- Swimming:** Prohibited in all lakes, streams, and reservoirs.
- Plants/Wildlife:** Collection of plant specimens or animals is not permitted.
- Launching:** All boating is by reservation only. Call (408) 355-2201 to make a reservation.
- Fishing:** License required for all persons 16 or older.



**Directions- Fun Ride**

Start- Leave camp, ride through gate to hills. Go about a hundred yards past gate.  
 Turn left on Harvey Bear trail. One way trail for fun ride.  
 Continue straight on Harvey Bear Trail where the big rides turn off.  
 Go through a gate, re-join big ride trail in about a quarter mile on Harvey Bear Trail.  
 Take Ed Wilson trail to the left. Begins as a road, turns into single track.  
 At the end of the single track, turn left on Harvey Bear trail to Calaveras Trail.  
 Take Calaveras (single track) a couple of miles and separate from big ride again. Fun ride continues straight, big rides go left.  
 Turn right a hundred yards past trail separation.  
 Go through gate to the right on Coyote Ridge Trail.  
 Turn left down big hill on Willow Springs Trail.  
 Continue on Willow Springs Trail back to camp.
